Born Too Soon is a registered charity set up in 1985 to offer information and support to families whose baby is being cared for on the Neonatal Unit at Kingston Hospital NHS Trust.

Our **specialist unit** cares for not only small preterm babies but also unwell newborn infants, and can care for up to 20 precious babies at any one time. We care for babies from 26 weeks upwards, weighing as little as 450grams and last year cared for 500 babies.

Born Too Soon **raises funds to purchase specialist equipment** and also **supports families** after they leave the Neonatal Unit at regular weekly meetings held at Welcare House, as well as providing support to the families whose babies sadly die.
