GROUP	Amount	Purpose
Fircroft Trust	£764	towards equipment needed to repair the pond at their Day Centre for people with mental health problems
Kingston Childminding Association (KCMA)	£224	to pay for I.T. training by Superhighways to enable KCMA staff to produce their newsletter in a pdf format suitable for e-mail
Kingston Federation of Allotment Gardeners	£1,440	towards annual running costs and the purchase of two composting demonstration bins
Kingston Friends of the Earth	£989	to pay for items needed for their work in Kingston schools to raise awareness about environmental issues and sustainable development
Kingston Permaculture Reserve	£1,800	to pay for a secure storage shed, tools, tree grafting and hedge laying training and other running costs including insurance and publicity
