PROPOSED WAITING RESTRICTIONS BEEHCROFT AVENUE, NEW MALDEN & HORSLEY DRIVE, KINGSTON

THE KINGSTON UPON THAMES (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO.*) TRAFFIC ORDER 20**

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames propose to make the above Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
2. The general effects of the Order would be;
 - to introduce additional “at any time” double yellow line waiting restrictions and single yellow line waiting restrictions (to apply from 11.00 a.m. to noon on Monday to Friday) in Beechcroft Avenue & Cardinal Crescent, New Malden;
 - to introduce additional “at any time” double yellow line waiting restrictions in Horsley Drive, Richmond Road, Tangmere Grove and Wittering Close, Kingston & Dickerage Road, New Malden;
 - to shorten (by 5 metres) an existing “at any time” double yellow line waiting restriction in Ardmay Gardens, Surbiton.
3. The proposed Order and other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order are available for inspection until 6 weeks have elapsed from the date on which either the Order is made or the Council decides not to make the Order at:
 - The Information and Advice Centre, Guildhall 2, Kingston upon Thames, KT1 1EU between 8.30 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive;
 - Kingston Library, Fairfield Road, Kingston, during normal opening hours;
 - New Malden Library, Sandal Road, New Malden, during normal opening hours;
 - Surbiton Library, Ewell Road, Surbiton, during normal opening hours;
 - Tudor Drive Library, Tudor Drive, Kingston during normal opening hours.
