Kingston Carers' Network

Caring for Carers

Kingston Carers' Network is a local registered charity, providing independent information, support and advice to people who care for someone living in the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames.

Kingston Carers' Network mission is to:

- listen to carers;
- provide independent information to carers, whether they choose to continue to care or give up their caring role;
- ensure that the role and expertise of carers is understood and valued locally;
- provide input into service planning and to ensure that appropriate services are available to carers locally;
- promote carer involvement in service planning;
- ensure that carers are aware of their rights and entitlements;
- reduce the social isolation and exclusion experienced by many carers;
- to raise awareness of carers' rights.

Who is a Carer?

A carer looks after someone living in the borough who cannot manage without that help.

They are not paid for the care they provide.

Carers' needs

There are about 12,500 carers in the borough. Many carers experience loneliness and stress, as well as physical and mental exhaustion. Unless carers receive the appropriate services they often cannot continue to care. Kingston Carers' Network can help carers to find out about and get the support they need.

Help for carers

Kingston Carers' Network can help by:

- listening to carers when they need to talk;
- providing information in a "Carer's Pack" and sending out a quarterly newsletter;
- offering one-to-one support to carers to ensure they are receiving their benefit entitlements and appropriate services;
- running support groups for carers;
- consulting with and ensuring that carers' needs are brought to the attention of those who plan and provide services to those in need in the borough.

Kingston Carers' Network provides information on:

- help that is available to enable carers to go on caring;
- opportunities for carers to have a break from a few hours to a holiday;
- financial matters such as benefits, allowances and sources of funding available to carers and their families;
- organisations and groups that offer support and advice on specific illnesses and conditions;
- mobility and transport issues for carers;
- educational and work opportunities for carers.

Kingston Carers' Network offers help to all carers, regardless of their age and the person they are caring for.

Carers can be young people still at school (please see Section 15 for information for young carers), people who are working full or part-time, parents of disabled children or young adults, or older people caring for partners, family or friends.
