Surbiton Town Centre Improvement Strategy

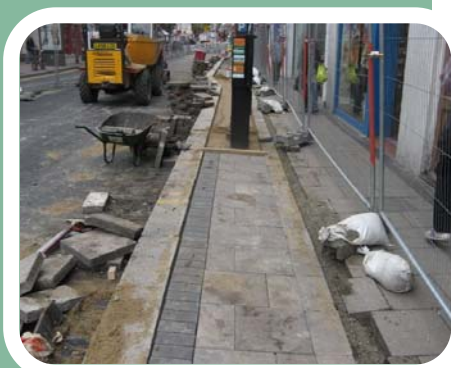
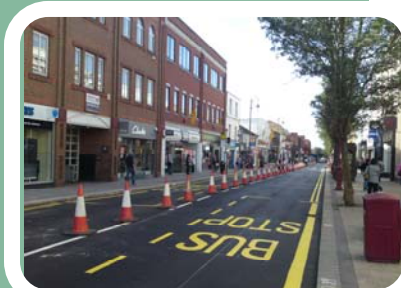
Work on the Improvements to Surbiton Town Centre has now been completed. This includes wider pavements in some sections, better access to bus stops, a new road surface and improved servicing for shops.

THANK YOU to all the businesses, residents and visitors to the Town who have been so tolerant and understanding during these essential works.

The pictures show the old tram tracks revealed under the former road surface, a section of the new wider pavement under construction and the completed work which was finished according to the agreed programme - in time for the Surbiton Festival which took place on 24 September.

These works are part of a wider Strategy for improvements in the Town Centre and public consultation on the next phase will be starting soon. This will include new paving and environmental enhancements such as new trees, benches and features to reflect and bring out the Town's own special identity.

The Expert Patient Programme: Join people making positive changes to their lives

The Expert Patient Programme (EPP) is an NHS-based six week training programme that provides opportunities to people who live with long-term chronic conditions to develop new skills to manage their condition better on a day-to-day basis. The course is very popular and offers new, positive perspectives to people living with chronic conditions. It is now being offered by GP practices within the Kingston area for their patients.

Set up in April 2002, EPP is based on research conducted over the last two decades which shows that people living with chronic illnesses are often in the best position to know what support they need in managing their own condition. Provided with the necessary 'self-management' skills, they can make a more tangible impact on their disease and quality of life.

Each week, two volunteer tutors lead 8-16 participants through structured course material covering topics such as relaxation, diet, exercise, fatigue, breaking the symptom cycle, managing pain and medication, and communication with health care professionals. Participants on the course also receive a free course manual called 'Living a healthy life with chronic conditions'.

The Community Library is a free home library service for anyone who is housebound and a resident within the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames. It helps people who are unable to visit a public library or carry books home.

Membership types

Individual: The Library visits individual residents every four weeks, offering large and standard print books, books on tape, music CDs and cassettes, videos, wool, jigsaws, a free request service and more. A box of items specially selected for you will be brought to your door, and you can choose as much as you wish from the box.

Group: Residential homes & other relevant groups are visited every 12 weeks, with large & standard print books and jigsaws supplied and deposited to a communal area.

Activity Officer: Media items are supplied for use by group and activity leaders in residential homes and other groups every 12 weeks.

Reminiscence User: Reminiscence materials are provided for use with older people in residential homes, groups and by other parties offering reminiscence sessions, with visits every 12 weeks.

Fostering in the community changes lives

Have you ever considered fostering?

Caring residents with the confidence to work with children and teenagers are urged to consider fostering to keep more looked after children living in their own community. A national shortfall of foster carers means that children in care currently have to leave friends, school and familiar surroundings if there is nowhere for them to stay locally.

The Kingston Placement Team, which finds safe places for children to stay when they can't live at home with their birth families, invites borough residents with spare time to consider fostering as a lifestyle choice.

Did you know how flexible it is?

More foster carers are needed to look after children full time, on a short-term basis or even at weekends to give other carers and birth parents a break.

Rewards and incentives

Those who look after local children on behalf of Kingston Council are paid a generous allowance and fee and receive full training and support from a friendly fostering team. This is in addition to the emotional incentive of helping a young person to live a happier and more fulfilled life.



Recruitment Officer Christine Appleyard (christine.appleyard@rbk.kingston.gov.uk) is available to speak to groups or organisations about the facts behind the current fostering crisis, throw light on what carers do and dispel some of the myths about who can become a foster carer.

Stay Safe Indoors with Free Home Safety Visits

London Fire Brigade wants you to be safe and is carrying out free home fire safety visits for residents in the Royal Borough of Kingston and the other London boroughs.

London Fire Brigade personnel will arrange to visit you in your home and along with providing and fitting smoke alarms free of charge, they will discuss any home fire safety issues or questions you may have and go through planning an escape route for you and your family in the event of a fire.

Fires in the home are the main cause of fire deaths. Getting a smoke alarm, regularly testing and maintaining it, as well as planning your escape route in the event of a fire, can dramatically decrease the risk of death or serious injury.



Cutting your fuel bills:

Free services to save energy and to save you money

Households can **save up to £270 per year** from fuel bills if you look into some simple actions.

Seek some free impartial advice from the *Energy Saving Trust* and '*Directgov - Stay warm in winter*' webpage now and see what actions you could take to save you money and keep you warm this winter.

If you are a home owner or live in privately rented accommodation, are on income related benefits, are over 60 or have a child under 5 in your household you could be eligible for discounts and grants to improve the energy efficiency of your home. **Call free phone 0800 512 012** and find out what grants you could be eligible for to improve the condition of your home and reduce any wastage.

Ask your energy supplier about what discounts they could offer for insulation or heating improvements. You can also ask accredited installers about *Energysmart*, a nationwide scheme giving discounts for energy efficiency measures.

Working with Climate Energy (previously known as CEN), the Council is supporting home visiting services in Kingston to bring energy efficiency advice services to your home. The first project, funded by NHS Kingston provides *free* advice on keeping warm and well for residents over 60, and is operating across the borough. The second project is funded by the Mayor of London whereby Chessington North/ Hook and Old Malden Wards will be receiving a targeted service from November to February 2012.

Any Council supported home visiting projects operational in the borough will be promoted with Kingston Council branding and will not support cold calling.

The Council are working to expand services offering discounted insulation and other home energy efficiency measures to all areas of the borough. In the meantime, take advantage of existing opportunities to keep warm and well this winter while saving money.

Why not try something different?

Aikido differs from most other Martial Arts in that it does not teach attack and is defensive in nature. Aikido is suitable for men and women of all ages as it does not rely on physical strength for its effectiveness. If attacked, the Aikido practitioner would not try to stop a punch by blocking it but would instead step aside and, by diverting the attacker's energy, lead them to the ground. Through regular training, students learn to harness their inner strength to overcome others who may be physically stronger.

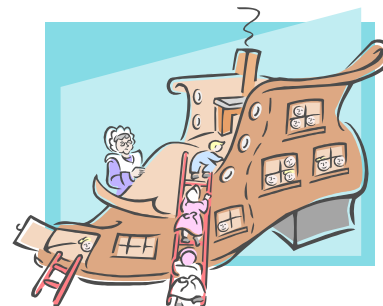
