THE KINGSTON UPON THAMES (PRESCRIBED ROUTES) (AMENDMENT NO. 29) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2021

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames on 18th October 2021 made the above Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.
- 2. The general effect of the Order, which will come into force on 1st November 2021, will be, on an experimental basis, to introduce a "Pedestrian and Cycle Zone" as part of the "School Streets" initiative in:
- PINE GARDENS, SURBITON (Christ Church C of E Primary School), between Chiltern Drive and Kings Drive and Manor Crescent, which will operate between 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. and between 3 p.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays; and
- PORTLAND ROAD, KINGSTON (St John's C of E Primary School), between Denmark Road and Three Bridges Path, which will operate between 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 2.45 p.m. and 3.45 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.
- 3. Motor vehicles will be prohibited from entering the "Pedestrian and Cycle Zones" during the operational hours, except for residents' and Blue Badge holders' vehicles. Residents and Blue Badge holders may apply for an exemption relating to either Zone SS5 (Pine Gardens) or Zone SS6 (Portland Road) which will be granted by the Council if approved. The Pedestrian and Cycle Zones will only be enforced during school term times.
- 4. The Order provides that, subject to the provisions of section 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Council's Director of Corporate and Communities, or some person authorised in that behalf by him, may, if it appears to him or that person essential in the interest of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for providing suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs, modify or suspend the Order or any provision contained therein.

7. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any relevant requirements thereof or any relevant regulations made

thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks from the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

8. The Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely by means of an Order made under sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Any person may object to the making of an Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation within a period of six months beginning from the date on which the experimental Order came into force, or if the experimental Order is varied or modified, beginning with the date on which such variation or modification came into force. Any objection must be in writing stating the grounds on which it is made and sent to either the Director of Corporate and Communities, Traffic Order Section, Guildhall 2, Kingston upon Thames, Surrey, KT1 1EU or to TMO@kingston.gov.uk (please quote ref. TMO-P317).

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The introduction of Pedestrian and Cycle Zones in Pine Gardens and Portland Road form part of the Council's "School Streets" initiative to increase sustainable travel, improve the health and safety of school pupils and to reduce traffic and parking problems that occur during school drop-off / pick-up times.

The Pedestrian and Cycle Zones are being introduced on an experimental basis, so that the effects on the surrounding area can be monitored and gauged, and may be modified if considered necessary.

The experimental Traffic Order will remain in force for a period of up to 18 months. The Pedestrian and Cycle Zones will be reviewed and assessed after six months (or six months from when any modification is implemented).

In due course, the Council will consider whether to retain the Pedestrian and Cycle Zones on a permanent basis, depending on the success of the measures.

THE KINGSTON UPON THAMES (PRESCRIBED ROUTES) (AMENDMENT NO. 29) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2021

Made: 18th October 2021

Coming into force: 1st November 2021

The Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into force on 1st November 2021 and may be cited as the Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 29) Experimental Order 2021.

2. (1) In this Order:

the Order of 2013" means the Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (No. 6) Traffic Order 2013*(c)*;

"enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment; and

"permit" means an exemption to the restrictions specified in Schedule 1 to this Order that has been granted by the Council to a vehicle used by a resident or Blue Badge holder, provided that the resident or Blue Badge holder:

- (a) has duly applied to the Council for an exemption;
- (b) has been notified by the Council of the "permit identifier" to indicate which restriction it applies to; and
- (c) is exempt only from the restriction to which the "permit identifier" relates.
- (3) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

Amendment of the Order of 2013

- 3. (1) Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2013 shall have effect as though;
 - (a) there were added to Schedule 2 to that Order the items numbered 276 to 277 and set out in Schedule 1 to this Order;
 - (b) there were added to Schedule 3 to that Order the items numbered Ex63 and Ex64 and set out in Schedule 2 to this Order.
 - (2) The relevant provisions of the Order of 2013 shall apply to the items set out in Schedules 1 and 2 to this Order.
- 4. In pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Director of Place of the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames, or some person authorised by him, may, if it appears essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs, and after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, modify or suspend any provision of this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order amends the Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (No. 6) Traffic Order 2013 to introduce Pedestrian and Cycle Zones ("School Streets") on an experimental basis in:

- Pine Gardens, Surbiton, in the vicinity of Christ Church C of E Primary School (between 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. and between 3 p.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays);
 and
- Portland Road, Kingston, in the vicinity of St John's C of E Primary School (between 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 2.45 p.m. and 3.45 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays).

The following exemptions apply to the Pedestrian and Cycle Zones:

- anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform (Ex1);
- any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to Section 66 or Section 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (Ex2);
- a pedal cycle (Ex4);
- any vehicle when used in an emergency for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes (Ex5);
- any vehicle authorised by the Council when used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such duties for that vehicle to enter the restricted area (Ex11);
- any vehicle authorised by the Council to enter the restricted area for the purpose of collecting refuse from the restricted area or from any land or premises fronting upon or accessible only therefrom (Ex15);
- dial-a-Ride buses;
- residents' and Blue Badge holders' vehicles for which an exemption has been granted (Ex63 and Ex64).
