The guidance made it clear that successful bids would be contingent on a local authority-owned site being made available on a long-lease, peppercorn-rent basis. The Diocese of Southwark agreed with the Council that: they would submit an application for a six-from entry (180 places per year) Church of England secondary school. The DfE have responded favourably to the application and accept that there is a need for the places which the school would provide. However, before they formally approve the proposal, they want sufficient assurance on a number of site and other matters. We are currently working through those issues and are confident that the school will be approved in the autumn, with a view to it opening on the Council-owned Kingsmeadow site (subject to formal disposal of the site and to planning permission) in 2022 or, more realistically, 2023.
