STATEMENT OF REASONS

In January 2020, the Kingston Town and Maldens and Coombe Neighbourhood Committees considered reports outlining the findings of a "Healthy Streets" study undertaken in the North Kingston area. The aim of the study was to identify potential locations and measures for improvement focused on sustainable transport, to reduce through-traffic and encourage walking, cycling and public transport use in the area.

This complies with Kingston Council's vision to make North Kingston a greener, healthier and more attractive place in which to live, play and do business.

In addition, The Mayor's Transport Strategy (MTS) identifies that motorised traffic is overwhelmingly responsible for the greatest environmental challenges we face as a city. Currently, road transport is responsible for half of the main air pollutants, with cars contributing around 14 percent of nitrogen oxides (NOx) and 56 percent of particulate matter less than 2.5 microns in diameter (PM2.5) emissions – some of the pollutants that are most harmful to human health.

Road danger is caused by the dominance of large, heavy, potentially dangerous vehicles that can move at high speeds in places where people want to be. Recent reductions in fatalities and injuries have mostly been achieved among drivers, while the risk experienced by people who are walking and cycling – who pose very little danger to other road users – remains unacceptably high.

Outer London high streets, town centres and communities are often traffic dominated, noisy and polluted, which impacts the local economy and residents' quality of life. The purpose of a 20mph speed limit is to reduce road danger and the severity of any collisions that occur and encourage as modes of transport such as walking and cycling.

Therefore, the Committees resolved that width restrictions (to vehicles exceeding 2.13 metres) would be introduced in Crescent Road and Queen's Road at their junctions with Kingston Hill, to address the issue with high volumes of HGVs entering the residential areas at the junctions. It was also agreed to introduce a 20mph speed limit in Crescent Road, Liverpool Road and Queen's Road.

The above width restrictions and 20mph speed limit came into force in June 2020 by means of experimental Traffic Orders so that the effects on the surrounding areas could be gauged.

Following the consideration of objections received and analysis of traffic data, it has been decided to retain the width restrictions on a permanent basis. The data shows that there is a reduction in HGVs and general traffic which will lead to an improvement in pollution and noise levels and help create a better environment to encourage the use of other modes of transport.




