- 2. The general effect of the Order, which will come into force on **7 March 2022**, will be to continue in force indefinitely the provision of the following Order The Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 16) Experimental Traffic Order 2020.
- 3. The effect of the Order is to retain on a permanent basis in Lower Ham Road, Kingston, prohibition of motor vehicles from entering the carriageway approximately 10 metres south of its junction with Bank Lane. The prohibition will not apply to pedal cycles.

THE KINGSTON UPON THAMES (PRESCRIBED ROUTES) (AMENDMENT NO. 38) TRAFFIC ORDER 2022

Made:- 28 February 2022

Coming into force:- 7 March 2022

The Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984*(a)*, as amended, and all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into force on 7 March 2022 and may be cited as the Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 38) Order 2022.
- 2. In this Order:
 - (1) "the Order of 2013" means the Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (No. 6) Traffic Order 2013(b);
 - (2) the expression "enactment" means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment; and
 - (3) any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

Amendment of the Order of 2013

3. (1) Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into force of this Order, the Order of 2013 shall have effect as though there were added to Schedule 2 to that Order the item numbered 246 and set out in the Schedule to this Order.

(2) The relevant provisions of the Order of 2013 shall apply to the items set out in the Schedule to this Order.

4. In pursuance of section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Service Director (Planning and Transportation) of the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames, or some person authorised by him, may, if it appears essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway, or for improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by this Order runs, and after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, modify or suspend any provision of this Order.
