EXPERIMENTAL WIDTH RESTRICTIONS AND 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT – IN AND AROUND QUEENS ROAD, KINGSTON (REF. KINGMAP0042)

The Kingston upon Thames (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 31) Experimental Order 2020; The Kingston upon Thames (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 31) Experimental Order 2020; The Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 15) Experimental Traffic Order 2020; and The Kingston upon Thames (20 MPH Speed Limit) (No. 3) Experimental Traffic Order 2020.

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames on 8th June 2020 made the above-mentioned Orders under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders, which will come into force on 22nd June 2020, are such that, on an experimental basis;
 - (a) width restrictions (to apply to vehicles exceeding 2.13 metres in width) are introduced on both sides of the road at the following locations;
 - (i) in Crescent Road, Kingston (outside and opposite No. 70). An adjacent 'shared use' parking place is shortened and a double yellow line "at any time" waiting restriction is lengthened accordingly;
 - (ii) in Queen's Road, Kingston (outside and opposite Sunningdale Court). An adjacent 'shared use' parking place is shortened and a double yellow line "at any time" waiting restriction is lengthened accordingly; and
 - (b) a speed limit of 20 miles per hour is imposed in Crescent Road, Liverpool Road and Queen's Road, Kingston.

Please note; a previous attempt to implement the above measures (our ref. KingMap0039, notice published on 12th March 2020) was not possible due to the Coronavirus pandemic. The associated traffic management orders are revoked and reenacted as above.

- 3. The Orders provide that, subject to the provisions of section 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Council's Director of Corporate and Communities, or some person authorised in that behalf by them, may, if it appears to them or that person essential in the interest of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for providing suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Orders runs, modify or suspend the Orders or any provision contained therein.
- 4. Due to the current Coronavirus pandemic, the experimental Orders and other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders (consultation documents) cannot currently be inspected at Guildhall 2. However, in line with guidance from the Department for Transport, the following alternative arrangements have been made;

- 5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation

Act 1984 or that any relevant requirements thereof or any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

6. The Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Orders should be continued in force indefinitely by means of Orders made under sections 6, 45, 46, 49, 84 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Any person may object to the making of an Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation within a period of six months beginning from the date on which the experimental Order came into force, or if an experimental Order is varied or modified, beginning with the date on which such variation or modification came into force. Any objection must be in writing stating the grounds on which it is made and sent to either the Director of Corporate and Communities, Traffic Order Section, Guildhall 2, Kingston upon Thames, Surrey, KT1 1EU or to TMO@kingston.gov.uk (please quote ref. KingMap0042).

STATEMENT OF REASONS

In January 2020, the Kingston Town and Maldens and Coombe Neighbourhood Committees considered reports outlining the findings of a "Healthy Streets" study undertaken in the North Kingston area. The aim of the study was to identify potential locations and measures for improvement focused on sustainable transport, in order to reduce through-traffic and encourage walking, cycling and public transport use in the area.

This complies with Kingston Council's vision to make North Kingston a greener, healthier and more attractive place in which to live, play and do business.

The Committees resolved that the following measures will be implemented:

Kingston Hill / Crescent Road - HGV Prohibition (width restrictions) - this will address the issue with high volumes of HGVs entering the residential area at the junction of Kingston Hill and Crescent Road. The prohibition will consist of physical carriageway restrictions to prevent HGV's access to the area or, alternatively, the implementation of CCTV cameras to manage/enforce.

Queen's Road / Kingston Hill - HGV Prohibition (width restrictions) - this will address the issue with high volumes of HGVs entering the residential area at the junction of Kingston Hill and Queen's Road. Similarly, the prohibition will consist of physical carriageway restrictions or CCTV cameras.

Regarding the 20mph speed limit:-

The Mayor's Transport Strategy (MTS) identifies that motorised traffic is also overwhelmingly responsible for the greatest environmental challenges we face as a city. Currently, road transport is responsible for half of the main air pollutants, with cars contributing around 14 percent of nitrogen oxides (NOx) and 56 percent of particulate matter less than 2.5 microns in diameter (PM2.5) emissions – some of the pollutants that are most harmful to human health.

Road danger is caused by the dominance of large, heavy, potentially dangerous vehicles that can move at high speeds in places where people want to be. Recent reductions in fatalities and injuries have mostly been achieved among drivers, while the risk experienced by people who are walking and cycling – who pose very little danger to other road users – remains unacceptably high.

Outer London high streets, town centres and communities are often traffic dominated, noisy and polluted, which impacts the local economy and residents' quality of life. the purpose of these proposals is to reduce road danger and the severity of any collisions that occur and encourage as modes of transport such as walking and cycling.






