# EXPERIMENTAL 'SCHOOL STREET' SCHEMES – IN AND AROUND ALEXANDRA ROAD AND PRINCES ROAD, KINGSTON AND BUCKLAND ROAD, CHESSINGTON (REF. TMO-P305)

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames on 31<sup>st</sup> August 2020 made the following Orders under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 19) Experimental Order 2020; The Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 20) Experimental Order 2020

- 2. The general effect of the above-mentioned Orders, which will come into force on 14<sup>th</sup> September 2020, will, on an experimental basis;
  - (a) introduce a 'Pedestrian and Cyclist Zone' at each of the following locations;
    - (i) in Prince's Road, Arthur Road and Borough Road, Kingston, operating between 8.15 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays (during school term times only);
    - (ii) in Buckland Road, Chessington, operating between 8.00 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. to 3:45 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays (during school term times only);

The following conditions will apply;

- during the operational hours of a scheme, entry to the zone for motor vehicles will be permitted by means of special dispensation only; and
- special dispensation (for entering the zone) will be granted by the Council to residents and businesses within the affected area (as well as to Blue Badge holders who register).
- (b) impose a system of one-way working for vehicles in Prince's Road (north-eastbound only), Arthur Road (south-eastbound only) and Borough Road (south-westbound only), Kingston.

The Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 21) Experimental Order 2020

3. The general effect of the above-mentioned Order, which will come into force on 28<sup>th</sup> September 2020, will, on an experimental basis, introduce a 'Pedestrian and Cyclist Zone' in Alexandra Road and Cherrywood Close, Kingston, operating between 8.15 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays (during school term times only);

The following conditions will apply;

- during the operational hours of a scheme, entry to the zone for motor vehicles will be permitted by means of special dispensation only; and
- special dispensation (for entering the zone) will be granted by the Council to residents and businesses within the affected area (as well as to Blue Badge holders who register).
- 4. The Orders provide that, subject to the provisions of section 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Council's Director of Communities, or some person authorised in that behalf by him, may, if it appears to him or that person essential in the interest of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for providing suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Orders runs, modify or suspend the Orders or any provision contained therein.

- 5. Due to the current Coronavirus pandemic, the experimental Orders and other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders (consultation documents) cannot currently be inspected at Guildhall 2. However, in line with guidance from the Department for Transport, the following alternative arrangements have been made;

- 6. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any relevant requirements thereof or any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
- 7. The Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Orders should be continued in force indefinitely by means of Orders made under sections 6 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Any person may object to the making of an Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation within a period of six months beginning from the date on which the experimental Order came into force, or if an experimental Order is varied or modified, beginning with the date on which such variation or modification came into force. Any objection must be in writing stating the grounds on which it is made and sent to either the Director of Communities, Traffic Order Section, Guildhall 2, Kingston upon Thames, Surrey, KT1 1EU or to TMO@kingston.gov.uk (please quote ref. TMO-P305).

#### STATEMENT OF REASONS

To improve the health and safety of school pupils and to reduce traffic and parking problems that occur during school drop-off / pick-up hours.

These measures will be subject to an Experimental Traffic Management Order (ETMO). An ETMO is the legal mechanism the council as traffic authority uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable. The ETMOs will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months to allow the assessment of any impact the school streets might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. A review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the measures should be made permanent after 6 months.
