1. **NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames made the below Orders on 30 January 2023 under sections 6, 45, 46, 49, and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984¹, as amended –
 - (a) The Kingston upon Thames (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 77) Order 2023.
 - (b) The Kingston upon Thames (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 77) Order 2023.
 - (c) The Kingston upon Thames (Bus Priority) (Amendment No. 10) Traffic Order 2023.
 - (d) The Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 41) Traffic Order 2023.

2. The general effect of the Orders which will continue in force indefinitely, The Kingston upon Thames (Charged-For Parking Places) (Amendment No. 47) Experimental Order 2021; The Kingston upon Thames (Free Parking Places, Loading Places and Waiting, Loading and Stopping Restrictions) (Amendment No. 47) Experimental Order 2021; The Kingston upon Thames (Bus Priority) (Amendment No. 7) Experimental Traffic Order 2021 and The Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (No. 3) Experimental Order 2021 which introduced the following restrictions:-
 - (a) mandatory, two-way cycle lane which will operate at any time;
 - (i) on the north-east side, from approximately 25 metres south of its junction with London Road to Nos. 1 to 7 Vicarage House; and
 - (ii) on the north side, from the eastern boundary of Vicarage House to No. 11 Cambridge Road;
 - (b) double yellow line “at any time” waiting restrictions and “at any time” loading restrictions (in place of existing waiting and loading restrictions);
 - (i) on the east side, between its junction with London Road and Nos. 1 to 7 Vicarage House;
 - (ii) on the north side, between Nos. 7 and 11 Cambridge Road;
 - (iii) on the south side, at the western boundary of St. Peter’s House;
 - (c) alter the operational times of an existing loading restriction on the south-west side, between its junctions with Church Road and Victoria Road), to apply on Mondays to Saturdays between 7am and 10am and between 4pm and 7pm;
 - (d) alter lengths of existing waiting and loading restrictions due to the introduction of a pedestrian crossing and relocation of bus stops (between its junctions with Victoria Road and Rayleigh Court); and
 - (e) remove existing bus lanes in Cambridge Road (eastbound, between Vicarage House and its junction with Rayleigh Court; and westbound, between No. 34 and St. Peter’s House).

STATEMENT OF REASONS

This is the first stage of a cycleway between Kingston and New Malden. The changes are a key element of the Council's cycling strategy to increase the amount of cycling in the borough especially for young, old and inexperienced cyclists. Authorisation to design and construct this scheme was given at the Environment and Sustainable Transport Committee on 11th February 2020.



TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ORDER

2023 No. 3

The Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 41) Traffic Order 2023

Made: 30 January 2023

Coming into force: 6 February 2023

The Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames, after consulting the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended, and all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as The Kingston upon Thames (Prescribed Routes) (Amendment No. 41) Traffic Order 2023 and shall come into force 6 February 2023.

2. In this Order:

“cycle lane” means any area of carriageway specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule to this Order which is bounded by a continuous white line on its south-east side and has signs marked thereon of the size, type and colour as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(b);

“enactment” means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

“pedal cycle” has the same meaning as in the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(b).

(2) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.

3. Except as provided in Article 4 of this Order, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle other than a pedal cycle to enter or proceed in the cycle lane otherwise than for the purpose of crossing it.
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall apply to:-
- (a) a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes;
 - (b) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform;
 - (c) any person who causes or permits any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed pursuant to section 66 or 67 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 - (d) in any case where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop in the cycle lane or is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident and as soon as reasonably practical thereafter causes that vehicle to leave the cycle lane;
 - (e) a vehicle being used in connection with the removal of any obstruction in the cycle lane providing that in all circumstances it is reasonably necessary for the vehicle to enter the cycle lane;
 - (f) a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority for the purpose of exercising any statutory powers or performing any statutory duties in the cycle lane, a vehicle being used in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the cycle lane, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway in or adjacent to the cycle lane, the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the cycle lane of any sewer, main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus, or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary for the vehicle to enter the cycle lane;
 - (g) (i) a vehicle while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the cycle lane are being unloaded from that vehicle or, having been unloaded therefrom, are being delivered; or
(ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on that vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the cycle lane or, having been collected, are being loaded thereon.




