Vision	To make Kingston and North Kingston Neighbourhood a better place to live, work and play by having high levels of resident engagement in community-driven activities which improve quality of life and benefit health and well-being.
Strategy	 Making community engagement and participation more effective and sustainable, based on the ideas submitted by residents to the Council during the plan's consultation. Encouraging local voluntary and community sector organisations, faith groups, charities and not-for-profit organisations to access Community Grants Funding and expand their capacity, and to align with local residents' feedback and objectives as set out within this plan. Ensuring the benefits of community engagement and community driven activities are clearly communicated to residents and are at the forefront of how we work.
Aims	 To enable as many people as possible in the neighbourhood to identify their needs and aspirations for the future of their area and stimulate community spirit. To become a key supporting document for neighbourhood committee decision making - in particular allocation of the Neighbourhood Grants fund. To provide evidence which can support future funding bids. To raise issues that may feed into statutory Council plans (e.g. the Local Plan) To raise issues that may feed into more general plans or inform delivery of services by the council or other local organisations.
Objectives	 Develop, promote and enhance the neighbourhood's parks, streets and open spaces to encourage more outdoor-based activity. Identify and implement innovative local projects which benefit and attract residents and businesses into the local Kingston area. Encourage the establishment of community hubs, "Friends of" groups, resident associations and community forums, and ensure the effective use of the Community Grant Programme funding.

Introduction

The Kingston and North Kingston Neighbourhood Community Plan has been developed to help inform local decision making, in particular, decisions relating to the award of the Kingston and North Kingston Neighbourhood Committee's Community Grants Programme. The plan includes ideas submitted to the Council during engagement undertaken in 2019/20. These ideas were subsequently reviewed and prioritised by local community volunteers in February 2020. These ideas and priorities have been used to develop the outcomes set out within this plan.

Further engagement was undertaken in February 2022 as part of the seizing the moment research and engagement project and more recently as part of the Local Plan consultation. The feedback received during these consultations supports the aspirations and the feedback captured during 2019/2020.

New ideas are always welcome and the plan will be reviewed annually by the Kingston and North Kingston Neighbourhood Committee at the start of each municipal year. During this review, the Committee will be given an opportunity to amend the existing plan as well propose new additions based on:

- feedback received from the Community during the previous year
- ideas, needs and priorities identified through resident engagement

Underneath the Community Plan sit a range of core council strategies and plans which capture other important activities not set out in this Community Plan.

This includes looking at tree planting and the installation of seating areas and benches, both in parks and in communal areas across the neighbourhood. 1 Work to deliver a safer, cleaner environment where residents and visitors alike feel safe, are healthy and encouraged to use alternative forms of transport	 The Neighbourhood Committee considers this priority when it reviews transport issues, highways and footways proposals and parking schemes. Encourage health improvement initiatives such as Play Streets, School Streets and support schools to implement meaningful School Travel Plans. Residents are kept informed about local footway repairs and improvement. Promote the use of alternative means of transport such as Bikeability. 			
2 - Ensure the continuity of the neighbourhoods cycling routes and ensure that are considered with the whole Neighbourhood in mind.	 Collaborate with Go Cycle to ensure the discussion, identification and promotion of the best routes for future cycle lane improvement to ensure disconnect is minimal including completion of basic go cycle network. Promote everyday cycling activities rather than just promoting individual events. Help to find and create secure bicycle parking to encourage more people to cycle including street cycle hangers Promote and prioritise cycling training for all. Work to develop a cycle/walking route that connects up key destinations across the neighbourhood including parks and open spaces.
