Those of you that can see the site will have noticed a large temporary white building next to the school's willow tree. This is the three-storey Morgan Sindall site office and compound.



The accommodation comprises four meeting rooms, two large open-plan offices with kitchenettes, several toilets, male and female drying rooms, and a canteen space—all big enough to cater for 80-100 operatives when the project is at its busiest. Whilst the new building will take us nearly 18 months to build, our site setup took us just two weeks...#loveconstruction!

As you may have noted, the pathway into and out of Blagdon Park from Burlington Road has had to be closed as it leads directly onto access for the construction site, which is where all site traffic, plant and deliveries are being routed throughout the project.

The pathway will have no access available during the following times:

Monday—Friday 07:00-18:00 and occasionally Saturdays 07:00 - 13:00

A gated entrance has been created that will be open outside of site working hours.
