To consider formally designating part of Southborough, Surbiton 8 a Conservation Area. On the 22nd November, 1978 the Committee onsidered the possibility of designating part of the Southborough area I Surbiton, show in on Plan PBK/1, as a Conservation Area, and resolved -
(1) the report be adopted for the purposes of public discussion and it be further considered in the light of any observations received, prior to any formal designation of a Conservation Area; and
(11) the GLC and other appropriate authorities be consulted on the action proposed.

The GLC were formally consulted under Section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971 and non statutory consultations undertaken with Kingston upon Thames Society, Kingston upon Thames Archaeological Society, Flmbridge Borough Council, Southborough Residents Association and Kingston Branch of the R.I.B.A. All households within the proposed Conservation Area, together with those pronerties abutting it, about 280 homes, were consulted by letter.

Some 22 trees on the boundary of 'Shrewsbury House' School, with Ditton Road, are included in the Royel Borough of Kingston upon Thamea Tree Preservation Order (No. 8) 1978, which has been confirmed without modification.
