- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames on 12th July 2021 made the above-mentioned Orders under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders, which will come into force on 26th July 2021, will be, on an experimental basis;
 - (a) to prohibit all motor vehicles (except for Blue Badge holders) from entering or proceeding in the "restricted area" (Bishop's Hall; and Thames Street, from a point 30 metres south of its junction with Clarence Street to Nos. 4 and 9 Thames Street) between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.;
 - (b) in Thames Street (on the west side, between Nos. 17 and 29), to introduce a single yellow line waiting restriction and a loading restriction (both to apply between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m.) in place of existing waiting & loading restrictions and disabled persons' parking spaces;
 - (c) in Thames Street (on the west side, outside Nos. 29 to 31), to convert an existing 'goods vehicles loading only' parking place to a 'variable use' parking place; for the loading & unloading of goods vehicles only between 8 a.m. and 12 p.m., maximum stay 30 minutes, no return within 1 hour; and for disabled persons between 12 p.m. and 10:30 p.m., maximum stay 3 hours, no return within 1 hour; and
 - (d) in Fife Road, Kingston, to convert 2 existing 'pay & display' parking spaces to 'variable use' operation i.e. for disabled persons (on Mondays to Saturdays from 8.30 a.m. to 6.30 p.m. and on Sundays from 11 a.m. to 6.30 p.m., maximum stay 3 hours) and for 'pay & display' (from 6.30 p.m. to 10.30 p.m., maximum stay 2 hours).
- 3. The Orders provide that, subject to the provisions of section 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Council's Director of Corporate and Communities, or some person authorised in that behalf by them, may, if it appears to them or that person essential in the interest of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for providing suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Orders run, modify or suspend the Orders or any provision contained therein.
- 4. Due to the current Coronavirus pandemic, the made Orders and plans cannot currently be inspected at Guildhall 2 until the building is open again for normal business. However, the following alternative arrangements have been made;

 - b) the made Orders and plans can be inspected at Council libraries which have reopened on a temporarily limited basis; and

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any relevant requirements thereof or any relevant regulations made thereunder have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
- 6. The Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Orders should be continued in force indefinitely by means of Orders made under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Any person may object to the making of an Order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation within a period of six months beginning from the date on which the experimental Order came into force, or if an experimental Order is varied or modified, beginning with the date on which such variation or modification came into force. STATEMENT OF REASONS

This project aims to create more welcoming, social and accessible street environments for businesses to benefit from, and for customers and visitors to Kingston town centre to enjoy. The part-pedestrianisation and timed road closure for Thames Street and temporary enhancements to the town centre will support the recovery of the local economy as we come out of lockdown, and enable local hospitality businesses to extend outdoor eating spaces.

The scheme will look to close the road space to traffic during the day time, and allow shops and businesses to make use of that space for visitors to the area. The area is used as an access point for deliveries and servicing to local businesses. Outside of the hours of operation, businesses will be able to undertake their deliveries as normal.

There are also a number of disabled parking bays within the area and provision has been made so that access is still available to those marked bays in Bishops Hall. Additional disabled parking spaces are provided in Fife Road and in the Guildhall complex (High Street).

These measures will be subject to Experimental Traffic Management Orders (ETMOs). An ETMO is the legal mechanism the council as traffic authority uses to control aspects of the way that the highway is used. They provide the legal backing to signs and road markings used on the highway and allow them to be enforceable. The ETMOs will be enforceable for a period up to 18 months to allow the assessment of any impact the measures might have on the area and surrounding roads, and to revise the scheme if necessary within that time. After the consultation period of 6 months, a review will be carried out to assess the initial success of the scheme and whether the measures should be made permanent.
