

Learning English



- Learning English is an important first step towards living in the UK.
- It will help you if you want to study a course at college, find a job, and socialise in your local community.

ESOL

- English language education for speakers of other languages is known as 'ESOL'.
- ESOL stands for <u>English</u> for <u>Speakers</u> of <u>Other Languages</u>.



 ESOL programmes are designed to help you develop the language you'll need for everyday conversations, such as buying things in a shop.

ESOL classes are offered at different levels - depending on how far along you are in your English-learning journey:



• <u>Pre-Entry</u>: beginner level.



• Entry 1: can give personal information and use simple vocabulary and phrases.



 Entry 2: can use simple past and future tenses, simply describe things, express feelings and personal opinions.



• Entry 3: can have every day conversations with a native speaker, has a good grasp of tenses and a wide vocabulary.



• <u>Level 1</u>: can use a variety of tenses confidently, can present an argument on a debate topic, and is able to produce complex writing.



 <u>Level 2</u>: can produce writing in a variety of styles such as memos, reports and essays, can discuss unfamiliar topics for debate in detail.



 There are lots of opportunities to learn and improve your English skills in Kingston.



 We know that different people have different needs - for example, some people might prefer online courses, and others might have childcare commitments that they need to work around.



 There are other ways to learn English too, and you can do this independently from home whenever you have time.
