Reporting an emergency



 Report emergency crime by calling 999 and ask for the police.



• To report non-emergencies, you should call **101**. You can also report incidents by visiting www.police.uk.

• If have safety concerns about a child, please call Kingston Council



• Call **0208 547 5008**, 8am and 5pm, Monday to Friday.



• During the night or at the weekend, call **0208 770 5000**.



• If you think a child or young person is in immediate danger, call 999.



- Worried about your own safety or the safety of another person?
- Call Kingston Council's Safeguarding Team on 0208 547 5005 between
 9am and 5pm Monday to Friday.



- Get help if you are frightened of your partner or frightened for your children.
- Kingston Violence Against Women and Girls Service offers free and private support.

Discrimination



 Racism and discrimination are illegal in the UK.



- This means no one should be treated differently because of their:
- gender
- Race
- Religion
- age
- Disability,
- sexual orientation
- marriage or civil partnership,
- pregnancy and maternity



 You should not be treated differently when you are applying for a job, looking for somewhere to live, accessing health services or buying something in a shop.



- If anyone you know is a victim of racism, report it by:
- calling 101
- in an emergency call 999
- you can report racism online
- or you can go to the police station in person.
